



Family. It is a song he hears when his family is together. The song

makes him feel happy.









Kino is a poor fisherman. He lives a simple life with Juana and



Coyotito. They do not have money, but they are happy together. Sometimes,



Kino dreams of finding a pearl in the ocean that will make him rich.



People will pay a lot of money for a beautiful pearl. Kino dreams of



having money to buy nice things for his family.











Suddenly, Kino sees a scorpion crawling into Coyotito's crib. A scorpion





is a spider that can kill people with its poison. Now, Kino hears the









Song of evil - the song that Kino hears when bad things happen to







his family. Kino moves closer to the crib. Juana prays that the





scorpion will not bite her baby. Kino tries to keep the scorpion away



from Coyotito.









It is too late! The scorpion jumps into the crib. It bites Coyotito on the





shoulder. Kino grabs the scorpion and throws it onto the floor. Juana

tries to suck the poison out of the bite. This is a way that people give





first aid to someone who has been bitten by a snake or spider. The





neighbors come to Kino's hut when they hear the baby crying. They







know that a scorpion bite can kill a small baby. Kino and Juana





take their baby to the doctor.













The doctor is rich. He knows that Kino and Juana are poor people.



He knows that they cannot pay him to help their baby. The doctor will









not help Coyotito. The doctor tells Kino to go away. Kino is angry



and embarassedthat he cannot help his baby.















Kino must go to work in the ocean. Kino and Juana go to





their canoe. The canoe is special to Kino. His father and grandfather







used this canoe to work in the ocean. They found oysters and



pearls and sold them to earn money. They also dreamed of finding the







great pearl. Now, Kino hears his family's other song-the song of the



great pearl.









Before getting into the canoe, Juana makes a special medicine for







Coyotito. She puts seaweed from the ocean on the bite. Sometimes,

people use plants to take care of bites and cuts. This is another way to



give first aid.











Then Kino, Juana, and Coyotito take the canoe into the ocean.



Kino wants to start his work.











Sometimes, Kino only finds oysters People use oysters for food.









Other times, Kino finds small pearls in the oysters' shells. A pearl



is made inside the oyster shell from a grain of sand. First, the sand





gets inside the shell and hurts the oyster's muscles. Next, the oyster

makes a covering to stop the pain. Then, the covering hardens to form a









pearl. Today, Kino hears the song of the great pearl.











Kino dives into the ocean. He sees many small oysters. Then, he





sees a large oyster shell. He can see a large pearl inside the shell.





Kino swims to the oyster. He picks it up and takes it to the







canoe. Kino is excited!











Kino and Juana do not want to open the oyster too quickly. They



wait a short time. Then, they open the oyster shell. They find the great









pearl inside! Next, Kino looks at Coyotito. The bite is healing! Kino





and Juana are very happy.





Kino finds the great pearl.







Kino and Juana bring the pearl to town. The people know that





Kino will be rich. Some people want Kino to give them money.









Other people want to steal the pearl from Kino. Kino dreams





of sending Coyotito to school.





Everyone wants the pearl.



The priest wants Kino to say a prayer of thanks for finding the





pearl. Then, he tells Kino that the church needs repairs. The priest



wants Kino to help pay for the repairs.





The beggars want Kino to give them money for food. The pearl





buyers want Kino to bring the pearl to them. They know they will



be rich if they can sell the pearl to the jewelry makers.





Everyone wants the pearl.







Then, the doctor tricks Kino. He says that Coyotito is not really cured.





He puts a powder on Coyotito that makes him sick again. Then, he





says that Kino must pay him money to help Coyotito get better.







Kino says that he will pay when he sells the pearl. The doctor







says that he wants to keep the pearl safe for Kino, but Kino





says no. Then, the doctor watches Kino's eyes to see where he hid



the pearl.





Everyone wants the pearl.









That night, the doctor sends a robber to Kino's hut to steal the









pearl. Kino wakes up and stabs the robber. Kino is hurt in the







fight, too. Juana tells Kino that the pearl is bad luck. She says







that they must throw the pearl back into the ocean. Kino wants to





keep the pearl. He says it will be good for their family.





Everyone wants the pearl.









The next day, Kino and Juana plan to sell the pearl. They



dress in their best clothes. They dress Coyotito in his best clothes. It is







a special day for Kino and the whole town. Everyone walks with





them on their way to town. Kino's brother, Juan Tomas, walks with







Kino. Juan Tomas and Kino talk about where to sell the



pearl.







Juan Tomas and Kino remember an old story. Long ago, men in their













town only sold pearls to the town's pearl buyers. The pearl



buyers in their town tried to cheat them. The men did not want to be







cheated. They decided to sell their pearls in another town. Those

men were killed. The priest told this story each year. He wanted the men



to stay in their own town. He said they would be punished if they











tried to sell pearls in another town. Kino thought about selling



his pearl.









The pearl buyers waited for Kino. They had a plan. One buyer





would offer Kino a small amount of money for the pearl. Then, the



others would agree. They did not want to give Kino too much money.







When they got the pearl from Kino, they would sell it in another





town for more money. The buyers wanted to cheat Kino. They thought











that Kino would be afraid to sell his pearl in another town.











Kino arrives at the town. He shows the pearl to a buyer. The

buyer pretends that it is not worth much money. The buyer is lying to







Kino. The other buyers look at the pearl. They tell Kino that the







pearl is too big. Kino knows that they are lying. Kino tells the



buyers that he will go to another town. The buyers try to give him



more money. Kino walks out of the shop.











Kino's neighbors do not agree with Kino. They think he must sell to







the town's pearl buyers. They believe that Kino will be punished for





going to another town. That night, robbers come to the house again.











They try to steal the pearl. They hurt Kino. Juana is afraid.





She wants to throw the pearl back into the ocean.











The next morning, Juana gets up before Kino. She creeps to the





fireplace. Kino hid the pearl under a stone there. She takes the







pearl and leaves the house. Kino follows her to the ocean.









Juana raises her hand to throw the pearl into the ocean. Kind



hits her. He is so angry that he cannot talk. He makes a sound like a



snake. He will not lose the pearl.





Kino must have the pearl.











Robbers follow Kino and Juana to the ocean. One robber tries to











steal the pearl from Kino. Kino stabs the robber Now,









Kino has killed a man. Kino did not want to lose the pearl.





Kino must have the pearl.









Kino and Juana must get away. Kino goes to his canoe.







Someone has put a hole in his canoe! Now, Kino hears the Song



of Evil again. It is getting louder in his head. Someone has destroyed









his family's canoe. He has hit Juana. He has killed a man. All of







these things make the Song of Evil louder. Still, Kino will not get



rid of the pearl.





Kino must have the pearl.







Kino and Juana go back to their house. Juana sees that the other



robber has been in their house. She gets Coyotito and runs out. The









other robber has set the house on fire! Now, Kino's family has no





canoe and no home. They hide in Juan Tomas' house until night.









Kino must take his family to another town. Kino thinks that







everyone wants to steal his pearl. He will not let anyone take it. He



tells Juan Tomas, "the pearl is in my soul now".





Kino must have the pearl.









At night, Kino and Juana leave their little town of Le Paz. They



go into the dry land away from the ocean. This land is strange to



them. Kino covers his tracks so that no one can follow. He knows







that they must go to another town to sell the pearl. He wants to







start a new life. Kino hears the song of the family. It plays quietly in

his head.













Kino and Juana rest during the day. Then, Kino sees the







hunters following them. The hunters want to steal the pearl. He knows







that they will find his family and kill them. He takes Juana and







Coyotito to the mountains to hide. He knows that animals hide from









hunters in the mountains too. Now, he hears the song of Evil. It plays

loudly in his head.















Kino finds a pool of fresh water in the mountains. Kino, Juana







and Coyotito stop at the pool. They drink the fresh water. Kind





knows that animals come to this pool to drink. They come to this







pool to kill other animals, too. It is a place of life and death.







Kino sees the hunters far away. He must hide his family in a cave.















At night, the hunters fall asleep by the pool. Kino, Juana and







Coyotito hide in a small cave. Kino knows that he must kill the







hunters to keep his family safe. He creeps down the mountain. Then,





Coyotito cries in the cave. The hunter thinks it is a coyote. He points his



rifle at the cave. Kino knows he must attack now.













Kino kills all of the hunters by the pool. Then, he hears a cry in









the mountains. It is the cry of death. The hunter killed Coyotito. Kind





and Juana return to their town. They know that they must get rid of











the pearl. Kino throws the pearl into the ocean. The song of









the Pearl goes away. Kino hears the song of the family. It plays

softly in his head.
